

Steps to inclusive water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH)

1

WaterAid **staff** have the skills and confidence to support partners to implement inclusive WASH.

2

WaterAid **partners** are aware of the human rights to WASH and apply this in their work.

3

Marginalised groups and individuals (such as people with disabilities, older people and people with chronic illnesses) are aware of their rights to WASH and their **communities** recognise these rights.

4

Marginalised groups and individuals are included in WASH management committees, activities and decision-making, and therefore able to claim their rights to WASH.

5

WaterAid **staff** develop tools to collect evidence on the barriers to WASH for marginalised groups and individuals.

6

WaterAid **partners** work with **communities** to use this evidence to engage decision-makers in inclusive WASH.

7

The **WASH sector**, **wider sectors** and **civil society** work together to advocate inclusive WASH.

8

Decision-makers are aware of their responsibilities, and provide, monitor and enforce inclusive WASH.
